

ROBERT BURNS (1759 – 1796)

Robert Burns is a renowned Scottish poet, born in Alloway, Ayrshire on the 25th January 1759 and died on 21st July 1796 at the tender age of 37. In that short time he produced in excess of 500 works entitling him to be regarded by many as the national poet of Scotland, and throughout the world. His poems have been translated into more than 40 languages including Latin and Esperanto and his face has featured on stamps, coins, and banknotes worldwide.

Annual celebratory dinners (normally referred to as Burns Suppers) are held on or around the 25th day of January in almost every capital city on the globe, with thousands more held in various size and form within local communities.

In addition to his original poetical works, Robert revised or adapted literally hundreds of Scottish folk songs, collected on his travels throughout Scotland.

Some of his most well-known works include; Auld Lang Syne, To a Mouse, Tam o' Shanter, A Man's a Man, A Red, Red Rose and Scots Wha Hae.

Who Are We?

RBANA is an association dedicated to the preservation and appreciation of the life, works and philosophy of Scotland's National Bard – Robert Burns, and to promote Scottish culture and heritage in North America.

The genesis for the Association came from a meeting in 1981 of representatives from six Burns Clubs, in Annapolis, Maryland. A committee was formed to further explore their ideas. In 1982 at a meeting in Hamilton, Ontario a constitution was drawn up and the name "The North American Association of Federated Burnsians" was adopted.

At the 2000 Annual General Meeting in London, Ontario the name "The Robert Burns Association of North America" (RBANA) was approved. RBANA is affiliated with the Robert Burns World Federation Limited, in Kilmarnock, Scotland.

Usually taking place in April or May, the RBANA Annual Conference and General Meeting is held every year, alternating between Canada and the United States.
